Johanna Lundy, French horn



JOHANNA LUNDY is an associate professor at The University of Arizona School of Music where she teaches French horn, chamber music, brass pedagogy, and mindfulness for performers. For 15 years, she held the position of principal horn with the Tucson Symphony and has performed across the US, Mexico, and Europe in solo, chamber, and orchestral settings. Her 2018 solo album Canyon Songs was hailed by Gramophone as "simply breathtaking" and an "impressively virtuoso performance." Lundy is the founder and director of the Borderlands Ensemble, a horn and strings chamber group devoted to sharing the stories of the borderlands region through unique concert experiences. The ensemble regularly collaborates with artists to create programs based on themes of Mexican and

Latinx history and has commissioned new repertoire by American, Mexican, and Indigenous composers. Lundy's background includes mindfulness, body awareness, and meditation, which she adapted into a new course that was offered this fall. "Mindfulness for Performers" helps students overcome barriers to perform their best in high pressure situations. She holds a Bachelor of Music from the Oberlin Conservatory and a Master of Music from the New England Conservatory.

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
