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More Information about the Music Minor

If you have a passion for music – whether it is a newly-found interest or something you have been involved in throughout your life – the highly-flexible Music minor could be a great fit for you. Courses from all areas of music can be combined into a unique program of study – one that can be tailored to work alongside your major coursework. If your cumulative UA GPA is 2.0 or higher, you may [contact a Music advisor](#) to declare the minor officially.

The requirements for the Music minor include:

- **MUS 119 Introduction to Music Theory**
You may take this 3-unit class first, last, or whenever it fits your schedule. This course is offered regularly as an in-person or online course and is taught most Fall, Spring, and some Summer, terms. If you have a music theory background, you may choose to take MUS 120A (Musical Skills & Structure, a 3-unit “Fall-only” course) instead of MUS 119.
- **15 additional elective Music units**
Any MUS (Music) and/or MUSI (Music Individual Studies) courses may be used in your Music minor. Additionally courses cross-listed or co-taught with Music may be included. There is no required performance element; conversely, ALL your elective units could be performance units if you choose.
- **Ensure that at least 9 units are upper-division**
A minimum of 9 of your 18 Music units must be upper-division (300/400 level). Many popular electives, as well as all large and small ensembles at UA (including the [Pride of Arizona](#)) are upper-division – and so meeting this requirement is usually easy to achieve. Connect with your [academic advisor](#) to ensure you are on track.

Additional helpful information:

- **Pride of Arizona Marching Band:** The world famous [Pride of Arizona](#) marching band offers course credit for all participants through enrollment in MUS 400B – and this credit counts towards the Music minor.
- **Lessons/Performance Studies:** If you are interested in taking individual lessons on your primary instrument or voice as part of the minor, an audition is required. Please see audition requirements for each studio [here](#). Availability of lessons to Music minors is contingent on studio capacity/enrollment as well as audition performance. All students enrolled in performance studies (MUSI 181/182/185/282/ 285/382/385/482/485) are required to participate in an appropriate large conducted ensemble (MUS 400A-Z) during the same semester. Ensemble placement is determined by an audition process designed and administered by the ensemble directors, in consultation with the faculty, and approved by the Director of the School of Music.
- **Ensembles:** There are numerous large and small ensembles open to all students through audition and many more that require no audition and no prior experience. Learn more [here](#) and connect with an [academic advisor](#) if you have any questions.
- **Prerequisites:** Some MUS courses are either sequential or have prerequisite requirements. These are shown in the Class Search at your UAccess Student Center. If you have questions about enrolling in one of these courses, you are welcome to contact the listed instructor or to connect with an [academic advisor](#).
- **Advising:** We recommend that you check in with your [Music minor advisor](#) briefly every semester or whenever questions arise. You should also plan to check in with an advisor, and consult the PDF version of your UAccess Advisement Report, prior to registering for your final semester, to ensure that your minor will be completed with your chosen coursework.

If the Music courses you take in your minor inspire you to do more – whether by switching to Music as your primary major or by adding a second degree or major – then great! You may find out more about our majors on our website. Every unit taken towards a Music minor may be applied to the Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree in Music. This is an interdisciplinary program that can be tailored to connect your musical interests with your other passions and study in related or unrelated fields. The Music major (in the BA degree) may require as few as 30 additional units beyond the Music minor. Connect with [your Music advisor](#) with questions, and to declare the major.
