The Bachelor of Music degree requires a minimum of 125 units, including a minimum of 42 upper-division units. (Upper-division courses are numbered 300-499). The Music Education major requires a minimum of 85 units, including a minimum of 18 upper-division units in residency at UA. Admission to this major requires a UA application, and a School of Music application – which includes a video interview and an audition on the student’s primary instrument (or voice).

A minimum 2.5 cumulative UA GPA, and a minimum 3.0 major GPA, is required for graduation with this degree. A grade of C or above is required for ALL major coursework (in every major course) to be admitted to the College of Education for student teaching.
