The BFA degree requires 125 units (minimum) of which 42 units (minimum) must be upper-division. (Upper-division courses are numbered 300-499). This major requires 80 units (minimum) of which at least 18 must be upper-division units in residence at UA. No more than 64 units total may be transferred from two-year college(s).

Portfolio Review: Upon initial admission to the IDA program, students may complete 100/200-level ART courses. Upper-division coursework toward the IDA program is only available to students who are accepted through portfolio review. The portfolio review process is offered once per year, intended for the Spring semester of the sophomore year. To be eligible, students must have completed most of their 100-level ART courses, and must have completed (or be currently enrolled in) ART 265 and ART 266.
